Dear Joe:

Relative to our previous discussions on a winter term directed study or intensive course on "Black Literature, History, and Sociology," I offer the following information for your consideration.

1. Winter Term 'A' - January 5 to January 30, 1970
Winter Term 'B' - February 2 to February 27, 1970
2. Type of Course
Either a directed study course for 25 or 30 students who research various aspects of a broad topic ending in a term paper and meeting during the first week several hours a day, the middle two weeks in special individual conferences, and the final week daily sessions to defend their findings from rough draft of the paper.
Or an intensive course of four weeks meeting about 2 to 3 hours each day during the entire period.
Or some variation which you can suggest for the purpose.
3. 6 Credits given for each part of the winter term.
4. Any assistance in reading or grading that the College can give will be provided.
5. An interdisciplinary course would be received well with you, Dr. Roane, and perhaps one other faculty member from B-C whom you would recommend.
6. Stipend, transportation, or board and room can be worked out to your satisfaction within the limits of the College budget.
7. Attached is an excerpt of guidelines for winter term directed study and a statement of the short winter term.

I would appreciate your reaction and response at your earliest opportunity so that the course or courses can be scheduled and the students enrolled as soon as possible.
